

The history of Otočac and Gacka Valley begins in distant prehistory. The Lasin civilization lived in the smaller area of the town we know today 6,000 years ago, and the **Japods** are likely the most famous of Gacka Valley's prehistoric residents.

The defensive island settlement of Otočac was built during the Middle Ages; its name appeared on the <code>Baška tablet</code> for the first time in the twelfth century. The Gacka Museum stores information on the earliest Gacka cultures and the <code>first Japodist route</code> in <code>Croatia</code> is also nearby. It leads, with the help of informative panels along the way, to the peak of the <code>Japodist settlement</code> on the forested <code>Humac hill</code>.



Two ancient archaeological sites, including still-standing **Mithraic shrines**, are close to Otočac. The carving on the stone depicts the sacrifice of a bull to the god Mithras. The members of this cult were primarily men.



Nine collections that document the region's rich archaeological, anthropological, cultural, historical, and artistic legacy are kept in the **Gacka Museum**, which is located in the heart of Otočac. The permanent exhibition is open to visitors throughout the year.





In the center of Otočac, opposite the Gacka Museum, there is a **parish church dedicated to the Holy Trinity**. It was already mentioned in the first half of the 17th century, and it probably existed even earlier.



**Fortica**, a famous Renaissance military fortress, was constructed in 1619, and its remnants can still be seen today. They clearly show a unique, triangular configuration of towers.

A stone way of the cross leads to the top of the hill of the same name with 15 stations, placed from the bottom to **the chapel of Our Lady of the Seven Sorrows**.



Gacka's Park of Croatian Memory, in the very center of Otočac, has a dual role. In addition to being a green area, it is also a sculpture park. It serves as a sort of time machine for the city of Otočac and the Gacka Valley and is situated next to the church and the main city park. On 32 cubes, there are inscriptions concerning historical figures and notable locals. It includes the time span between the ninth century and the reign of Duke Borna to the beginning of the twenty-first century. A large number of young artists contributed their work to the historical

creative journey. On each sculpture, significant individuals, historical occurrences, or cultural facts that are connected to the region of Gacka and its locals, but also significant in the larger context of Croatia, are memorialized in chronological order.







Our tradition is our most valuable treasure. Even though we are honored to hold it in our memories and hearts, we are happy to share it with you. We hope to do this by introducing you to our way of life, our values, the importance of craftsmanship, and the expressiveness of our folk dance and music.

The art of creating a solo tambourine, also known as a *kuterevka* or *dangubica*, is one of the components of our culture listed on the **List of Intangible Cultural Assets**. This important group also includes *prelo* (a form of rural sociability), so as the old craft of building the typical raft.

In addition to the traditional **folklore costume**, the fabric costume is manufactured using a weaving technique that is unique to the Dinaric region, which is what we are known for. Another item from the prestigious list above is the handmade **Lika bag** (traditional bag from Lika), which demonstrates how to preserve the original handcrafted technique.



Last but not least is *ojkalica*, a musical expression, that folklore groups strive to preserve as one of the cultural heritage.




**Coklja** is traditional handmade woolen footwear, and the art of making them has been declared an Intangible Cultural Heritage of Croatia.


Thanks to the diligent residents of Gacka Valley and Lika, who prevent it from being forgotten by regular use, *coklja* has successfully withstood current trends for years. It is a component of the Otočac town's traditional folk attire.

The Lika cap with tassels (fringes), distinctive black and red color, is the most famous symbol of Lika. A chain stitch was used to embroider the circular and spiral patterns on the cap, which we

Many mothers and sisters who lost loved ones in the Battle of Krbava Field wear this cap as a symbol of their agony and grief.

Double spiral rings that reflect the swirls of the actual combat are depicted on the rim, and the fringes flow with sorrow and agony (tears) for the fallen heroes.





A karst river with a constant volume of water and an incredibly slow, tranquil flow, Gacka resembles a gracious lady in every way. It is also famous for its minor temperature variations throughout the year. The average annual temperature is 9.4°C (7.9°C in winter; 10.8°C in summer). Due to the ideal water temperature, good chemical composition, and muddy bottom, the water is abundant in plants, ranging from mosses, algae, and stem plants.

As one of the many animals that call Gacka a home, the river is well-known for its brown trout, a species of fish that lives there. It is a heaven for passionate fishermen, and because there is a lot of food and oxygen there, trout grow 5 to 7 times quicker there.







Only a few of the approximately sixty mills that once ran on Gacka are still functioning. Today, those on Majer's spring are the most popular ones (and, I must confess, the loveliest). Four of them stand out as particularly intriguing examples of traditional maritime architecture and antiquated crafts in addition to their ongoing victory over time, water, and modern life in their "struggle" with these factors.







Innumerable works of art have drawn inspiration from this river, which also serves as a source of solace, joy, and friendship. It is widely claimed that everyone who has visited the Gack Valley always returns to it since each season has a unique story to tell. Take a stroll alongside it or along the promenade for a special view of the old **Stone Bridge**, which links the upper and lower parts of the city. And if you don't think that saying is true, try to visit Gacka Valley only once!



Along with Majer's, **Tonković spring** is fascinating and should not be missed. Our mills are among the top locations in the region for great social media photos.



The Croatian Center for Indigenous Species of Fish and Crayfish in Karstic Waters, in addition to becoming a major tourist destination in Otočac, is also a remarkable example of how animal species are protected and preserved in our nation. On the tour, which takes place in Ličko Lešće, you will not only be able to admire the natural beauty of the Kostelka spring but also learn about trout, including how it develops, what makes it unique, and the different types that can be found there.












The breathtaking beauty of the surrounding landscape is the first thing you will notice if you turn your gaze toward the Gacka Valley. We can genuinely take pride in having almost unspoiled nature, which is perfect for vacations as well as for sporting events and outdoor activities.














The *police*, potato halves, are made with local potatoes from the Lika region and are one of our favorite dishes.

These potato halves are unpeeled potatoes that have been split in half and roasted in the oven. With the *police*, we used to eat some bacon and sauerkraut, but now we consume a variety of meats and cheeses.



You must be familiar with the famous lamb from Lika, but did you know that potatoes and a lamb from a certain breed of sheep called Lika Curly (pramenka) are registered as Protected geographical indication?

Even now, sheep-raising is still a tradition in our region, and lamb is still a popular and high-demand dish. Along with lamb, other specialties like a rotisserie pig roast, sauerkraut and smoked pork, game stew served with polenta, cured meats, and baked trout with salted potatoes are always on the menu.





### What would a meal be without dessert to complete it?

Our most well-known and historic pastry, *masnica*, is also our favorite. Traditionally, women would make it for their husbands' brunch in the fields as a snack or dessert.


Along with masnica, miliprot -a.k.a. kuglof, cake with jam, apple, or cheese pie - was also produced. The plum, which is the most popular fruit in our region and from which jam is traditionally made, is also used to make knedli od sliv or dumplings stuffed with plums.



Speaking about sweets, I can't help but mention that Otočac has always been a beekeeping community, and more and more of my friends are producing **honey**, which is regarded as a premium ecological good thanks to the hard effort of both bees and beekeepers. Visit our "Gacka Honey Trail" to sample this nutritious and delicious treat. There are 12 honey points in it.

I kept our *šljivovica* until last even though an aperitif is consumed before a meal. Because of our reputation for producing *rakija* – plum brandy –, it is still brewed in the same manner as in the past, although in considerably lesser amounts. *Rakija* is an essential part of life in the community; it is deeply integrated into our tradition, and it is used to toast, celebrate, and lament; sometimes there's a drop too much, so we'll probably start to sing.

You can taste the majority of these classical dishes at our restaurants, either traditionally prepared or with a modern twist.




Our pizzas are so excellent that even I, with my traditional preferences, truly enjoyed them.







The majority of events in Otočac take place in the green heart of the town – the town's park – which is beautiful all year round.














